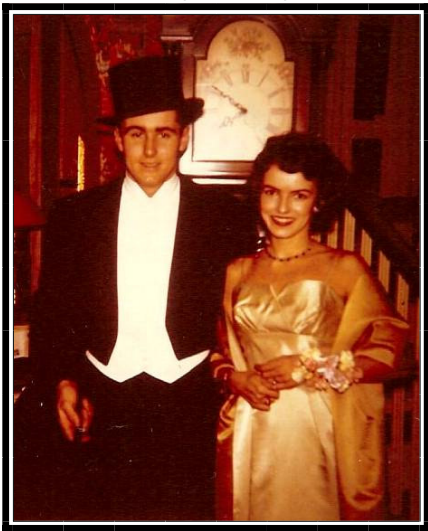
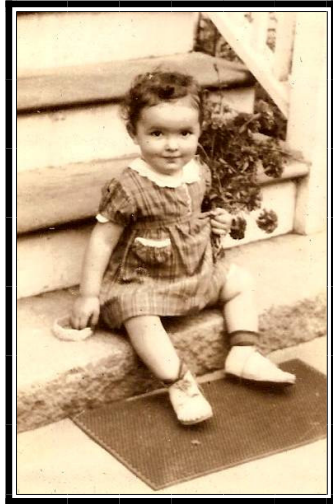
## In Celebration of Ginnie FitzGerald

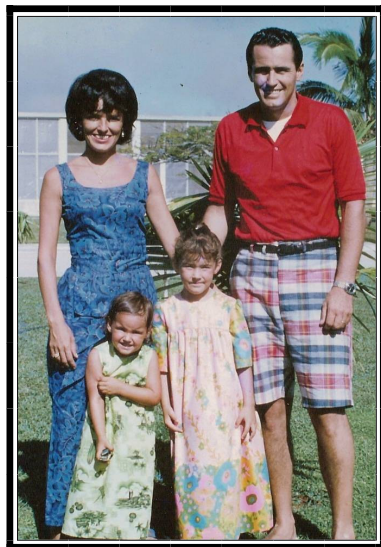
Ginnie was born in Newton, MA on February 9, 1938. The daughter of the late Adrienne (Messier) Milott and Paul E. Milott Sr., and the sister of an older and younger brother, Paul and Everett, respectively.

Ginnie was a strong, independent and very intelligent woman! She attended Newton High School and received her BA of Economics from Regis College in 1961, followed by her Master of Arts in Education from Boston State College in 1962.

That year she married her high school sweetheart, Pete FitzGerald whom she had met one Christmas Eve, on a blind date! Their marriage was still strong after 45 years!



During the 1960s, their two girls, Lyn and Karen, were born. Ginnie spent much of that decade as a military wife, traveling to different Air Force Bases, including Guam! She sewed clothes for the girls, and roughed it on the secluded island all with a smile! The family finally settled in Miami, FL in 1969.

During the 70s, Ginnie was a homemaker, teacher, and school administrator. Pete's pilot career allowed the family to travel often and see many a car or air race!

In 1978, the family moved to Atlantis FL near Palm Beach. The one constant through the years was Mattapoissett. Having enjoyed Crescent Beach as a child, Ginnie introduced it to her kids. The family spent many summers at Mattapoissett.

Never one to sit still, Ginnie became a volunteer at JFK Hospital in Florida and later retired as the Director of Volunteers.

In 1982, on their 20th anniversary, Ginnie and Pete remarried in Las Vegas, with their daughters as bridesmaids! This was done while attending a Formula One car race, of course!

The 90s were full of fun and family. Lyn was married in 1988 and Karen in 1995. Ginnie was most excited about the idea of grandkids! Once they were born, she spoiled them and loved them like only a special grandmother can!

In 2004, she marked the anniversary of the 1954 Hurricane by compiling a book of local stories and photos. The book was published as Hurricane Carol: 50 Years Later-A collection of memories past and present. She donated the profits to the Crescent Beach Improvement Association, CBIA.
